JUMPING AND WITH STYLE COMPETITION**

Half the course is run over show jumps and the other half of the course is run over simulated Cross Country Jumps (including narrow jumps, corners, bounces etc.)

Entries close on 18th February 2012

Greatwood Clear Round - £4.00 Entry on the day – height approx 70cm (This class will run for an hour before the start of Class 1 and will run on a first come, first served basis – restricted entries.) All proceeds from this class will be donated to Greatwood Horse Power.

Class 1 Mini Team 70 cm (2'3" – 2'6") **NSEA QUALIFIER**
Age 13 & under as at 1st Jan 2012

Greatwood Clear Round - £4.00 Entry on the day – height approx 80cm (This class will run for an hour before the start of Class 2 and will run on a first come, first served basis – restricted entries.) All proceeds from this class will be donated to Greatwood Horse Power.

Class 2 Novice Team 80 cm (2'6" – 2'9") **NSEA QUALIFIER***
*** Riders under 19 on 1st Jan 2012**

£35 per team, £10 per individual. Cheques made payable to Millfield.

Each class will have rosettes to 6th place. There will also be a rosette for the best style mark. Marks are given for style around the whole course which are converted into penalties.

Horses/riders may only compete once in each class to a maximum of 2 classes.

This event is based on the B.E JAS competition and will run under B.E. rules for x.c. regarding permitted tack & clothing. School logos are permitted.

NOTES (British Eventing Rule Book)

COMPETITORS' DRESS RULES

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 Hats

Protective Headwear, as listed below, must be worn by competitors at all times when mounted in BE80, BE90, BE100 and BE100 Plus classes. When jumping, including warming up, all riders must wear 'Protective Headwear' i.e. a hat which meets one of the following standards British All PAS 015, BSEN1384 } Provided they are European EN1384 } BSI Kitemarked or SEI American All SEI ASTM 95, ASTM F1163 and SNELL E2001 Australian & New Zealand All AS/NZS 3838 1998.

Harnesses must be correctly fastened. Competitors are strongly recommended to check their hats regularly and to replace them if damaged, or following a fall.

1.2 Body Protector

A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled Level 3 body protector, manufactured in the year 2000 or after, is mandatory for Cross Country and whenever else a body protector is worn. Competitors are strongly recommended to check their body protectors on a regular basis and to replace them if damaged.

It is strongly advised that the body protector should impede neither flexibility nor balance. The up to date BETA list of body protectors may be obtained from BETA – see www.beta-uk.org.

1.3 Inflatable / Air Jackets

If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector, it must be worn over a permitted body protector.

1.4 Spurs

Spurs must be of smooth metal, blunt and incapable of wounding a horse.

'Dummy spurs' with no shank are allowed but if there is a shank it must not be more than 3.5cm long, must point only towards the rear and, if curved, the shank must point downwards.

Metal spurs with round plastic or rubber knobs, 'Impuls spurs', are allowed.

Rowel spurs are permitted only for the Dressage Test, including the warm up.

Rowels must be fitted vertically, must be free to rotate and must be round and smooth. Tines are not allowed.

Spurs are compulsory only in Advanced and FEI 2*, 3* and 4* dressage tests. In Young Horse Classes, competitors may only wear blunt spurs without rowels.

NSEA Rules 2012 for all competitions listed on the NSEA

website All schools to be members of the NSEA and provide the secretary with their membership number on the Entry Form. Only the Team Manager (Team Trainer, Supporting Teacher, Riding Captain or the appointed responsible adult for that school) of each school is to deal with the Secretary. (for declarations, enquiries, objections etc) This should be the person/s listed on the NSEA Membership Form. (Further Team Managers can be emailed to us at a later date)

Objections must be made by the Team Manager only, within 5 minutes of the end of the class, in writing, with a £30 deposit.

Video/photographic evidence is not admissible.

Riders

Riders must be in full time education at the school/ college they represent in 2012. (age u19 on 1st Jan 2012)

A rider may only compete once in any team, therefore cannot compete two horses in the same team.

A rider may not compete in both mini and open classes.

For **MINI/70cm** competitions, the age of rider must be 13yrs & under on 1st Jan 2012.(except Grass Roots Competitions)

Horses

Any horse competing at 1m-1.05m may not also compete in the 70cm class at the same competition.

FEI Pony/ JRN horse/rider combinations are not eligible to compete in any 80cm classes Grass Roots

No horse may be ridden by two different riders in the same class except in NSEA Grass Roots Competitions.

A competitor in Grass Roots Competitions cannot have successfully completed in NSEA 80cm classes or above.

At a grass roots competition, the 70cm (mini) class can be open to riders up to the age of 18yrs.

JUMPING WITH STYLE – ARENA EVENTING

NSEA JwS Rules (as follows)

1. This competition is run on the lines of B.E JAS competitions. The main difference is that the emphasis is more on the rider's **style and effectiveness**, and the **harmony between horse and rider** at school level. The style mark for the horse does not apply in Schools' Competitions, so the horse's ability has less influence in the marks.

Class 1 70cm Riders 13 & under on 1st Jan 2012

Class 2 80cm – **Open to riders who have not competed at BE pre-novice or higher**

Class 3 90cm - **Open to all except horse/rider combinations that have competed at BE**

JRN Champs, Junior or Pony Final Trials & Champs

Class 4 1m-1.05m – Open to all

Championships – all courses will be raised 5cm at the Championships.

2. The competition begins with a show jumping round started by a bell. The rider completes the show jumping section, then passes through the timing beam into the x.c. phase, which has an optimum time, and completes the x.c. phase. The show jumping **is not against the clock**. This all takes place in one arena.

3. The winner will be the person / team with the fewest penalties once the following have been added together:

- s.j. jumping penalties

- x.c. jumping penalties

- x.c. time penalties

- overall style penalties (awarded for both s.j & x.c phases)

4. Style mark – for horse/rider combination, including the position and effectiveness of the rider, with the ability to show a difference between the s.j and x.c phase, through their style of riding. This will be judged by an accredited trainer or an elite rider.

5. The aim of the competition is to achieve the fewest penalties from the total of the four components – sj penalties, xc penalties, style and x.c speed (as close to the optimum time as possible).

Some x.c. fences have a knock down top rail. If this is knocked down, 4 penalties will be added to the penalty score.

XC colours to be worn – incl body protector & skull cap to comply with BE Rules.

Hats may be tagged by BE or Pony Club.

PENALTIES FOR S.J AND X.C PHASES OF JWS

Knockdown 4 penalties

1st Refusal 4 penalties

2nd Refusal 8 penalties

3rd Refusal Elimination

1st Rider Fall 8 penalties

2nd Rider Fall Elimination

Horse Fall Compulsory Retirement

Retaking an obstacle already jumped Elimination

Every commenced second over the time allowed 1 penalty

Exceeding time limit (3times the time allowed) Elimination

SPEED FOR X.C. PHASE

MINI – 325 m/m

NOVICE & INTERMEDIATE – 350 m/m

OPEN – 375 M/M

NOTE – NO STOP WATCHES ALLOWED

6. There will be a 2 minute warning given to riders not ready to jump, before elimination.

7. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest style mark (fewest style penalties) will be the winner. If still equal, the one closest to the optimum time will be the winner.

8. All team members are automatically eligible for individual placings, unless stated on a schedule.
